1. Vocational Preparation



English & Communication this looks at preparing for work (CV, letters etc); language skills for business; media; novel; play; short story; film.

- 3 Work Experience placements over the 2 Years
- 2 Placements in 5th Year and 1 Placement in 6th Year
- All 2 week blocks



Certification awarded at 3 levels

PASS	120 - 139 credits	60-69%
MERIT	140 - 169 credits	70-84%
DISTINCTION	170 - 200 credits	85-100%
